To help with the family needs, we will take up a special collection at all the Masses on this weekend, January 25th and 26th, one month after her passing. I am grateful to you our parishioners for your donations to this family who is now without a mother and sister. Let us pray for the Us-Perez children and for Juana's Sisters & Brothers: Elsa, Hilda, Adelaida, Jorge, Juan, and Ely in their great sorrow.

This Sunday, we celebrate the **3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time**. In our gospel today, Jesus calls his disciples to a new way of life in the reign of God. At its most basic, **discipleship means following Jesus, getting behind him and going wherever he leads.** For these first disciples it will be a difficult road, and despite their initial obedience to Jesus' call, in the coming days they will often fail both to understand and to obey him. They will sleep through his agony in the garden of Gethsemane, they will flee when he is arrested, and Peter will deny that he even knows Jesus. In the final verse of today's reading, Jesus himself begins to enact God's reign. In his teaching, in his preaching, and in his ministry of healing, he announces and reveals God's light dawning on a dark world, God's rule triumphing over the powers of evil and death. This week, I invite you to spend some time in prayer and ask yourself "I am a true disciple of Jesus" and "How am I living my life as one of his disciples today?"

This weekend, January 25 & 26th, we will take up a special collection for the family of Juana Us Perez who was killed on Christmas morning. Please see page 2 for more information.

The blessing of throats couldn't come at a better time as Catholics and Protestants alike cough their way through the winter months. But soon they will have a chance at healing. On the feast day of St. Blaise, many churches will hold the annual blessing to protect people against and heal them from throat ailments. Many adults have fond memories of this ceremony, when the priest places two blessed candles joined in the shape of a cross at each person's throat and says a prayer for their health. **In honor of the feast of St. Blaise, blessing of the throats will take place after at all the Masses next weekend** with the following prayer: "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, may you be delivered from all illness of the throat and all other evils. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
