

Pope Francis' Prayer invoking Our Blessed Mother's Protection for the Coronavirus

Arise: Restoring Catholic Life after the Pandemic

The Archdiocese of Philadelphia recently launched "Arise: Restoring Catholic Life After the Pandemic," an initiative to invigorate parish life after COVID-19 restrictions are lifted (archphila.org/arise). The initiative provides parishes and Archdiocesan institutions with guidance and resources for worship, catechesis, evangelization, and communications to help clergy and faithful reintegrate into active, in-person participation in Mass and parish activities. A committee representing various Archdiocesan and pastoral ministries has been hand-selected by Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez to spearhead the multi-faceted initiative. The committee is being led by Reverend G. Dennis Gill, Director of the Office for Divine Worship, and Meghan Cokeley, Director of the Office for New Evangelization. On Sunday, May 10th, the initiative will kick-off with the "Resurrection & Restoration: Archbishop Pérez's Easter Video Series." This seven part series will break open the mystery of the Resurrection of Jesus and his power to bring us new life in the midst of the pandemic. It is also designed to help transition back into in-person life in the Church as COVID-19 restrictions slowly lift. Every night for one week, 15-minute videos available in English, Spanish and American Sign Language translations will be posted to Archbishop Pérez's facebook page.

Ascension Thursday - May 21st

"I go to prepare a place for you"



On Thursday we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. After Jesus rose from the dead on Easter Sunday, He remained on earth and appeared to many in resurrected form. After forty days, Jesus ascended into Heaven, leaving the mission of the Church under the care of the Apostles and promising to send the Holy Spirit as their guide on Pentecost (which we will celebrate next Sunday). We relive these events liturgically during the Easter season. The first reading recounts the Ascension as recorded by Luke in the book of Acts, which is the sequel to the Gospel of Luke. Why did Jesus ascend? Was He abandoning His followers? By no means! Jesus ascended in order to reign over the kingdom of the Church from heaven. But He did not leave us orphans. Jesus promised the Holy Spirit to guide us. In saying to His disciples, "you will receive power when

the Holy Spirit comes upon you," He promised the very presence of the divine with them. Jesus is fully God and so is the Holy Spirit. Thus, whether Jesus stayed or ascended, God would be with them! Jesus, in His flesh, was limited to one geographical location. By ascending and sending the Holy Spirit, the faith could spread to the ends of the earth. Just imagine having to travel to Israel to meet Jesus in person! Instead, the Holy Spirit dwells within us here and now; and Jesus is present to us in the Eucharist whatever part of the world we are in. Jesus sent His disciples to be "witnesses" to the ends of the earth, and He promised to give them everything they would need to succeed. The fact that we are following Jesus 2,000 years later is evidence of their success. Jesus calls us to be His witnesses to the world by spreading the gospel. The Holy Spirit gives us everything we need to succeed. Look for opportunities this week to share about Jesus with people in your spheres of influence and ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in those moments.

Last But Not Least



Today we celebrate the 6th Sunday of Easter Sunday and Mother's Day. Jesus tells His disciples that their love for Him will be shown by their obedience to Him. Jesus will ask the Father to send the Holy Spirit, another Advocate, who will never leave them. The Holy Spirit will lead them into all truth and will never leave them. The world cannot receive the Holy Spirit because it doesn't want Him. When Jesus is raised, they will know that He and the Father are one. Jesus' promise is that the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, will come and continue Jesus' work in His followers. Following Jesus means more than a particular spirituality or religious tradition. The true followers of Jesus are those who obey His commandments. If we say we love Jesus but continue to sin we are deceiving ourselves. Likewise, we cannot claim to have the Holy Spirit if we live unholy lives. To love Jesus is to obey Him.

I remind you that in light of the developing Coronavirus pandemic, the Archdiocese's decision to suspend the public celebration of all Masses in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia is still in effect. Our church is open daily for private prayer. You are free to come on Sundays from 2:00pm to 5:00pm, Mondays from 8:30am to 7:00pm with adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and Tuesday thru Saturday from 8:30am to 10:00am.

During the month of May, we are using the Upper Church due to work being done in the Lower Church. Some things that you may notice when you return is the **touchup painting in the Lower Church**, **new railings in the sanctuary of the Lower Church and choir area**, signs in the parking lots regarding **authorized parking** and the **shrubbery trimmed** around the rectory. We are currently working on **repairing the outside speakers for the Church bells**. We continue to **clean and sanitize the pews in the Upper and Lower Church**.

We are in the process of sending letters out to those neighbors on Lawrence Street letting them know that we are now requiring a permit to park in the School parking lot. Overnight parking will be permitted with permit from 5:00pm to 7:00am. A limited number of permits will be issued on a first come/first served basis. Only one permit will be given to any household.

I remind you that our **Rectory office hours: 9:00am to 12:00pm (Monday through Friday).** Thanks for reading, stay healthy, reach out to those close to you by phone, text message, or social media and in the midst of all this have a good week.
