PRAYER FOR PEACE IN OUR COMMUNITIES

O Lord our God, in your mercy and kindness, no thought of ours is left unnoticed, no desire or concern ignored. We pray to you, O Lord, that we may have eyes to see what is possible when we reach out beyond fear, beyond anger, to hold the hand of our sisters, our brothers.
