# THE PENNSYLVANIA GREEN PHASE & THE ARCHDIOCESAN OPEN PHASE

Archbishop Perez through the Archdiocesan Office for Divine Worship and for Office for Communications has announced the following updates for the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

- ♦ The faithful continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days until restored by an announcement from the Archbishop.
- All public celebrations of Mass, all other Sacraments and devotions are restored. The
  procession with the Gifts during the Offertory of the Mass continues to be suspended until
  further notice.
- ♦ The invitation for of the Sign of Peace and the distribution of the Precious Blood continues to be suspended until further notice.
- ♦ Church Capacity can move to 75%....with social distancing, except for families of the same household.

### From St. Helena Health Promotion Office on Budgeting

Reducing stress is a good Self Care step. Making a budget is a way to begin. When we begin to make a budget, we need to prioritize our needs and wants.

- 1. What is the total money that comes into your house every month?
- 2. How much do you usually spend for: Mortgage/ rent, Food, House utilities, Household expenses, Clothing, Phone/ internet, Education, Special family events

Oh, more bills than money! Now we learn how to budget. We might not be able to pay each bill entirely but we can pay something in each category each month. We might even need to decide NOT to spend money on something this month. We can talk to people in our household to help make monthly decisions about the budget. In doing so, we reduce our stress, improve family communication, and recognize the gifts and talents of young people. Putting financial order into our lives affects us on many levels. # Pope Francis has announced that the period between May 24, 2020 and May 24, 2021 to be designate as Laudato Si' year for the Catholic Church. For your consideration...

This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her. We have come to see ourselves as her lords and masters, entitled to plunder her at will. The violence present in our hearts, wounded by sin, is also reflected in the symptoms of sickness evident in the soil, in the water, in the air and in all forms of life. This is why the earth herself, burdened and laid waste, is among the most abandoned and maltreated of our poor; she "groans in travail" (Rom 8:22). We have forgotten that we ourselves are dust of the earth (cf. Gen 2:7); our very bodies are made up of her elements, we breathe her air and we receive life and refreshment from her waters. (Laudato Si' #2)

• Reflect on these words as you notice the beauty of God's creation this week. How are you using or abusing the goods of the earth? Pay attention to the weather this week. What are the changes in our weather (more hurricanes, more earthquakes, floods, volcano eruptions, extreme temperatures) telling us? Are the changes in our weather stream a sign from God telling us to be more aware of how we treat our earth?

Biblically a tithe means 10%. All are asked to consider returning 10% of our income to the Lord (5% to the parish, 5% to God's other charities: e.g. St. Helena Outreach Center, Food Bank) in gratitude. The spiritual practice of tithing disposes us to make God first in every area of our lives! The aim is to secure not the tithe, but the tither, not the gift, but the giver—for God!

## **Last But Not Least**



**Today, we celebrate the 14<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time.** All of us enjoy receiving invitations—to a meal, a wedding, or a concert. Usually, when the invitation is printed on a little card, there are cryptic letters written at the bottom: RSVP. They are an abbreviation of a French request to reply to the invitation. We know what those letters mean but, not everyone knows that. In our gospel today, Jesus speaks what are among the most tender and appealing words he ever uttered. Jesus extends to us an invitation: Come to me all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Do you sometimes find yourself weary – from struggles, pains, disappointments? Jesus' invitation, 'Come to me' is always open, especially when you really need the peace, rest, protection and God's love. What will be your RSVP? You can ask God to come into your poor heart and to fill it with what only God can give. In that secret place heart can speak to heart. Ask today for what you want and be open to what God sees best to give you.

Have you ever wondered why you need to register with your church? Can't you just come to Mass and go about your business? Of course, the short answer to that is, yes, you can, but there are very good reasons to register. Church is about our experience of God in community. The first step to community is getting to know one another. When people register at the church, it gives the staff an opportunity to know a little about you: your name, where you live, your profession, languages you speak, your interests, hobbies, etc. It also gives you a chance to know your church better because the staff can then contact you and keep you informed. Registering is the first step toward getting involved and becoming a member of the community. You also need to be a registered parishioner and practicing Catholic in order to be a Godparent for Baptism and Sponsor for Confirmation. For those who are registered, we thank you and we want you to know we are working hard for you. If you haven't yet registered, are new or are not registered here at St. Helena, please call the rectory for an appointment to get you started as a member of our parish faith community.

Finally, Philadelphia has been given the OK to move into the green phase of recovery. Although we are in the green/open phase, the faithful continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days until restored by an announcement from the Archbishop. Now that we are in the green/open phase, the Reception into the Church (RCIA) will take place on Saturday, July 25<sup>th</sup> at the 4:30pm Mass and First Communion will take place on Sunday, July 26<sup>th</sup> at the 11:15am Mass. Both of these celebrations will be in the Lower Church. We are grateful that we are gradually getting back to some sense of normality.
