St. Joseph: A Model for Workers... May 1st is the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. It was in 1955 that Pope Pius XII proclaimed May 1st as his Feast for being Patron Saint of workers around the world. Saint Joseph, who made a decent living as a humble carpenter, is an exemplary model to all of us on how Christ may be glorified through our works. He is also a reminder that the value of the work we do should always uplift the dignity of the worker and never become an instrument of immorality or abuse. When we hear that it is the Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker, our most immediate reflection will probably be about job or employment or career. That is true especially because he worked diligently on his craft.

But his sainthood was much more than the secular work. The more important aspect in the life of Saint Joseph is the example of spiritual work he had shown throughout his life. The many challenges he faced, we continue to face today; and to a great extent, we can look up to this Saint and "work" on those life challenges the way he did.

Friday's during Lent ~ A Time for Prayer



On Fridays during Lent, we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am until 7:00pm followed by Mass at 7:00pm. **Stations of the Cross will be prayed PRIVATELY this year.** Copies of the Stations of the Cross book will be available in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese. 1st Sunday of Lent ~ Words to Read and Reflect

Readings: Genesis 9: 8-15; 1 Peter 3: 18-22; Mark 1: 12-15

"The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan."

Today is the first Sunday of Lent. This Sunday, the gospel reminds us of the 40 days of Jesus' struggle in the desert. This experience of Jesus gives us an imprint of truth about fulfilment - that every achievement or triumph one can attain always has its underlying 'rupture' behind. The 40 days in the wilderness of Jesus is his experience of abandonment or rupture. It were days of tests, temptations, loneliness, an internal "annihilation." In his confrontation with Satan, Jesus comes to understand exactly what God is calling him to do. We find ourselves confronting the question, especially during this time of COVID, "how to live our 'imperfect' lives to the fullest, to the happiest, to the most meaningful." This week, spend some time in the "WILDERNESS/DESERT." In our wilderness times we are tempted to listen to the voices that lead us away from God...Radio, television, and internet voices. These voices tell us that the good in our lives.....the God in our lives....is represented by money, power, security, fame. Now all of these are good things. But good things become evil when Satan tries to convince us that we don't need God in our lives. We become out of balance. We get confused about what is truly meaningful in our lives and what gives our lives true purpose. The temptation is to believe that all of our "stuff" is all we need to be happy and feel better. We begin to think that happiness is just around the corner if only we can have more things, more wealth, more security we will be happy. The challenge in all of this is to live our lives knowing that God will provide everything we need to be happy. As you spend time in the wilderness/desert this week, listen to the voice of God and ask God to prepare you for whatever temptations might arise when you find yourself being tempted.

Biblically a tithe means 10%. All are asked to consider returning 10% of our income to the Lord (5% to the parish, 5% to God's other charities: e.g. St. Helena Outreach Center, Food Bank) in gratitude. The spiritual practice of tithing disposes us to make God first in every area of our lives! The aim is to secure not the tithe, but the tither, not the gift, but the giver—for God!

Last But Not Least



Today we celebrate the 1st Sunday of Lent. Lent is a wonderful time that brings us closer to God. It provides us with the opportunity to renew our relationship with God and others. It is a forty day journey to the memorial of the Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection. Traditionally we begin the Lenten journey with the imposition of ashes, as a reminder of just how fragile our lives really are. We are dust and to dust we shall return. We are also reminded that we are sinners and, that we must turn from our sin and turn to God. However, because of our sinful nature we are totally unable to save ourselves. We therefore need someone who has the power to save us. Scripture tells us that the Lord Jesus who is sinless and perfect has taken on our sin and paid the penalty for it once for all. Nevertheless during this journey the Church recommends fasting or abstinence, prayers and works of charity as penance for our own sin and other people's sin. Today's gospel story reminds us that we are not alone on this journey. We journey with Jesus. Just as Jesus was tempted in the desert, so too are we tempted today by many things. Let us utilize the coming days to draw closer to God. Let us quietly open ourselves to God and prayerfully offer to Him all the sacrifices we make during this time. Let us listen more attentively to the good news of God in the coming days. Let us truly repent for our sins and make ourselves ready for the fullness of grace brought forth through the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus.

Please remember our parish children who will on Tuesday, February 23rd at 7:00pm receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time in the Lower Church.

This week, we will ponder **St. Joseph, A Model of Workers.** (See page 3 for a short reflection St. Joseph. In honor of the Year of St. Joseph, we will pray the **Memorare to St. Joseph** at the end of Mass. Copies are available next to the bulletins.
