CRS Rice Bowl: Dominican Republic Black Bean Soup

- 3 cans black beans, drained
 3 tablespoons olive oil
 3 cloves garlic minced
 3 cups water
 2 bay leaves
 2 cups cooked white rice
- 2 onions finely chopped1 green or red bell pepper finely chopped1 cup celery chopped2 teaspoons oreganosalt and pepper to taste



Sauté onions, peppers, garlic and celery in oil until soft. Stir in oregano and bay leaves and cook for 1 minute. Add water and drained beans and bring to boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer for 1 hour, stirring occasionally. When soup begins to thicken, remove from heat, remove bay leaves and stir in salt and pepper to taste. Using a potato masher or the back of a spoon, mash some of the beans to thicken the soup a bit. Adjust seasoning and serve with rice.
