

Lessons St. Joseph Wants to Teach All Humanity Today

Lesson #3: We are Called to Embrace Reality – A Happy Death

Aside from being patron saint of numerous causes, St. Joseph is especially known for being the patron of a "happy death." While this idea is not explicitly Biblical, it stems back to a tradition that developed over time through Christian imaginary and religious art. During this pandemic when so many relatives, friends, neighbors and people of our world are suffering the effects of illness, death and injustices in our health care systems, St. Joseph teaches us something critical about Christian happiness. It is not about avoiding suffering. Rather, it is about embracing whatever reality comes our way in the love and grace of Jesus and Mary. This doesn't mean we remain

complacent with our current state of affairs. Rather, it's quite the opposite. Remembering that Jesus and Mary are always by one's side, we have the Christian faith, hope and love necessary to transform our broken world—no matter how ill, old, poor or in pain one might be. The faith Christ taught us is what we see in Saint Joseph. He did not look for shortcuts, but confronted reality with open eyes and accepted personal responsibility for it." St. Joseph helps us to embrace and transform all our reality. This time with him, Mary and Jesus right by our side.

Mass in Honor of the Eternal Father

Sunday, August 1st (the first Sunday in August) is the Feast of the Eternal Father. An 8 day preparation for the feast starts Sunday, July 25th. Mass will be celebrated at 5:00pm on Sunday, August 1st in the Lower Church. (No Benediction) The Consecration Prayer to the Eternal Father (see below) should be prayed for the 8 days prior to the feast.

CONSECRATION PRAYER TO THE ETERNAL FATHER

My dearest Father, please accept this offering of myself – my body, mind, and soul: I praise you for your creation – all your works and wonders. I thank you for giving me life and for all that you have done for me. I offer up to you all that you have so generously given me. I am sincerely sorry for not knowing, loving, serving and honoring you as I should. I embrace my inheritance as your child, both the joy and the responsibilities. I give you my Yes so that I may be an instrument of your Will. I pledge my fidelity and ask for the grace of steadfastness and perseverance in my Faith. Most loving, caring, and merciful of Fathers, in your Divine Presence, I sincerely proclaim my love for you: I give myself (and my family) to you; and I solemnly consecrate myself (and my family) to you - now and forever. Dearest Father, as your child, I ask: That you send Mary to guide me to Jesus, and that Jesus sends me the Holy Spirit so that they may all bring me to you. That you dwell with me and in me - a living temple prepared by Mary, dedicated by Jesus, and purified by your Holy Spirit. And may I always be with you and in you. That you permit me, as your child, to be your true and intimate friend - one who loves you above all things. And that you come to me when I die, to bring me home to you. I further ask you, Father, for the sake of all mankind: To have mercy on all your children - past, present and future. To bring peace to the world and to gather all your children to yourself. And that your Kingdom come and your Will is done on earth as it is in heaven. Amen.

STATEMENT FROM ARCHBISHOP NELSON J. PÉREZ REGARDING REINSTATING THE OBLIGATION TO ATTEND SUNDAY MASS

"We have all felt the impact of COVID-19 in as individuals and families. It has been a time of acute hardship and struggle, of separation and isolation. It has also had an impact on our lives of faith. Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, has been with us throughout this challenging period and is most especially near to us when we encounter him in the Eucharist. The Eucharist offers us His healing and peace, His mercy and reconciliation. It is now time for everyone to return to the Eucharist with renewed faith and joy.

As many aspects of life are now returning to normalcy, each Catholic Bishop in Pennsylvania will **reinstate the obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and Holy Days beginning on Sunday, August 15, 2021, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.** The Bishops previously jointly decided to dispense the faithful from this obligation in March of 2020 in order to provide for the common good given concerns over the developing pandemic. Now, with the impact of the pandemic considerably reduced, it is again possible for the faithful to assemble for the Eucharist. It is time to lift the dispensation from the obligation.

The obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and Holy Days be reinstated on Sunday, August 15, 2021, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

From the Pastors Desk.... Last But Not Least

Today we celebrate the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today's first reading and gospel focus upon the Eucharist, the center of our life as Catholic Christians. The Eucharist is the sign of God's love for us and God's abiding presence in our midst. The first reading describes how the miraculous manna fed the Israelites as they wandered around the wilderness for forty years. The Eucharist is our daily bread as well. But it is not simply physical food – it feeds our spirits. And just how does it do this? What do we experience when we attend the Eucharist? How are we nourished? How are we given food for spiritual growth? How does our own community regard the Eucharist? What do we have to say about it? Remember we are a community of Christians – we are not solitary individuals! Furthermore, our community of faith stretches back through history as well as across today's geography. What did our ancestors say about the Eucharist that is still nourishing for us? Above all, we can share our experiences of the Eucharist with one another. Such sharing will not only equip us with words to break open the Eucharist for others, but it will deepen our own appreciation and understanding of this great mystery celebrated daily in our midst.

I urge you to take advantage of our parish religious education program. As soon as a child enters first grade, he or she should be enrolled in a religion program. Our religious education program is a formal (not Sacramental) program for children in grades 1 to 8 who attend a Non-Catholic school. High School and Adults who need the Sacraments are enrolled in our RCIA program. **Registration for PREP & RCIA takes place beginning today and throughout the month of August.**

Finally, as many aspects of life are now returning to normalcy, the **Catholic Bishop in Pennsylvania will reinstate the obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and Holy Days beginning on Sunday, August 15, 2021,** the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. **The last Live-Streaming Vietnamese and Spanish Sunday Masses will be August 8th.** St. Helena Church is open and we are happy to have you and visitors join us for Mass. All regularly scheduled weekday and weekend masses are open to the public for those who wish to attend. Thanks for reading, please be safe, try to stay cool, and have a good week.
