Year of St. Joseph ~ December 8, 2021 to December 8, 2021



St. Joseph, Guardian of the Redeemer

God the Father chose St. Joseph to be the foster father and guardian of Jesus. He was the protector and provider for the Holy Family, for Jesus as a child and as He grew into manhood. One example that portrays the difficulties and trials that Joseph underwent to guard Jesus and Mary was their long journey fleeing to Egypt to escape death by Herod's soldiers. They came to a land that was totally unfamiliar to them, seeking to earn a living in a country in which they did not speak the language. Since we belong to Christ and His Church through baptism, and Jesus was under the

protection of St. Joseph, it follows fittingly that St. Joseph is our guardian, too. His role is to watch over us and protect us, and, therefore, St. Joseph can rightfully be called the "guardian of the redeemed." We can see one example of how St. Joseph is meant to be our guardian through the life of St. André Bessette. Born in 1845 in Quebec and given the name Alfred, he was orphaned by the time he was 12. He could barely read and write, was sickly most of his life and had to work to support himself. Alfred persevered with courage because throughout his life, he was deeply devoted to God and St. Joseph and always believed that St. Joseph would "guard" him. André desire to increase devotion to St. Joseph inspired him to found a shrine to his favorite saint across the street from Notre Dame College. He saved the money he earned from giving haircuts at five cents apiece, eventually earning the \$200 he needed to construct a simple structure. This shrine opened in 1904, and, in 1909, Brother André was released from his duties as doorkeeper and assigned full-time as the caretaker of the Oratory of St. Joseph.

From the Pastors Desk.... Last But Not Least

Today we celebrate the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time and the Queenship of Mary. Today's gospel reading captures a moment of crisis for the followers of Jesus. Some of those who have already responded to the call of Jesus to follow him, to become his disciples, are now struggling to accept the claims he has been making for himself, in particular his claim to be the Bread of Life that has come down from heaven. Take a moment and put yourself in the disciples' shoes. How would you respond if Jesus were saying all of this to you? Would you be overwhelmed, excited, frightened, or elated? John tells us: "Many of Jesus' disciples turned their backs on Him and went back to their homes." However, Simon Peter approached Jesus and said: "Lord, there is no one else whom we can go to. You alone have the words of eternal life." Peter then affirmed his belief that Jesus truly was God's Holy Son! We all have doubts in Jesus at times. Often these are the times we distance ourselves from Jesus. Yet these are the times when we need to approach Him and talk with Him. We may question Him or perhaps simply sit in His presence and allow Him to wrap us in love and light. We are the ones who leave Him. Jesus will never, ever leave us!

It was so good to see some new faces this past weekend. As was stated by Archbishop Perez, the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days was reinstated on August 15th. However, by longstanding Church law, this obligation does not apply to those who are: sick, have a serious health risk, live in a household with those at risk, serve as primary caregivers to those at risk, have serious anxiety or concerns about being in a large-group setting due to COVID-19, or are unable to attend Mass in person.

Finally, I continually thank all those who are contributing via Sunday envelopes, drop off envelopes or e-giving to our weekly contributions and special collections especially during these hard times. Your contribution helps to keep our churches looks beautiful. Thanks for reading, please be safe, try to stay cool, and have a good week.
