

## Lessons St. Joseph Wants to Teach All Humanity Today

#### Lesson #2: The Name "Joseph" is a Reminder that Our Life is Not About Us

Joseph is living his name. The name "Joseph" etymologically comes from the Hebrew "to add" or "to increase." For Joseph, it was not "added" personal blessings or even "added" personal sanctity he received to show off to the world, but rather Joseph "increased" glory always for those around him first. Joseph always directed his energy toward Mary and Jesus. His entire life focused on loving the people right in front of him: his wife and his son. In doing something so ordinary with extraordinary love, he fulfilled God's mission for his life, and helped Jesus fulfill his. This is precisely

why he becomes a model for us of what the ideal Christian life is about: to be a true "person for others" is to give all glory to Christ and Mary. Is it really a surprise then, growing up with an example of radical service and humility like his father Joseph, that Jesus teaches his disciples that "whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the servant of all"? As the saying goes: "Like father, like son." It seems to apply to Jesus at both an earthly and divine level.

## World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly ~ July 25, 2021 Happy Grandparents & Elderly Day to All



Pope Francis announced the institution of World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, which will take place each year on the fourth Sunday in July, close to the feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. On the occasion of the First World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly, Pope Francis grants Plenary Indulgences to grandparents, the elderly and all the faithful who participate "motivated by a true spirit of penance and charity." The Plenary Indulgence will be granted under the usual conditions: sacramental

confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer, according to the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff during the solemn celebration he will preside over in St. Peter's Basilica or at the various functions that will be held throughout the world.

#### STATEMENT FROM ARCHBISHOP NELSON J. PÉREZ REGARDING REINSTATING THE OBLIGATION TO ATTEND SUNDAY MASS

"We have all felt the impact of COVID-19 in as individuals and families. It has been a time of acute hardship and struggle, of separation and isolation. It has also had an impact on our lives of faith. Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, has been with us throughout this challenging period and is most especially near to us when we encounter him in the Eucharist. The Eucharist offers us His healing and peace, His mercy and reconciliation. It is now time for everyone to return to the Eucharist with renewed faith and joy.

As many aspects of life are now returning to normalcy, each Catholic Bishop in Pennsylvania will **reinstate the obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and Holy Days beginning on Sunday, August 15, 2021, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.** The Bishops previously jointly decided to dispense the faithful from this obligation in March of 2020 in order to provide for the common good given concerns over the developing pandemic. Now, with the impact of the pandemic considerably reduced, it is again possible for the faithful to assemble for the Eucharist. It is time to lift the dispensation from the obligation.

The obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and Holy Days be reinstated on Sunday, August 15, 2021,

the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The last Live-Streaming Vietnamese and Spanish Sunday Masses will be August 8th.

**Today we celebrate the 17<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time.** Today's gospel narrates to us one of the greatest miracles of Jesus – the feeding of about five thousand people out of five barley loaves and two fish. This is the only miracle recorded in all four gospels. Jesus takes pity on the crowd that has followed him and invites them to sit down. He then breaks bread and blesses it and the fish and distributes them. All eat and the apostles collect twelve baskets of fragments at the end of the meal. All are amazed and want to proclaim Jesus as king. But Jesus slips away because he knows that this is not the will of the Father. The apostles are fearless when standing before the Sanhedrin. Gamaliel, a Pharisee, reminds the Sanhedrin that this group will fail if they are not from God; but if they are, then nothing will be able to stop them. So the apostles are flogged and released. The apostles rejoice that they have been able to suffer for Christ. It is as if the Word and the life of Christ shed for them has changed them forever. How does the Word of Christ resonate with you? Have you allowed this Word that you have heard and the Bread of Christ which you have shared to touch you? Spend time with Christ. Allow yourself time to be touched deeply. Let Christ become the center of your life and of all you do.
