

Apostolic Letter by Pope Francis "Patris Corde" – "With a Father's Heart" Part 1: A Beloved Father

Parent Reflection: Christians have always shown great respect for St. Joseph as the foster-father of Jesus and beloved spouse of Mary. It is fitting that Pope Francis invites us to increase our love for St. Joseph by dedicating a year to this remarkable saint. Joseph is righteous man, who gives us an example of a loving fatherhood modeled on the perfect fatherhood of God. God the Father chose St. Joseph, a man of faith inspired by grace, to care for Jesus. Just as God, our Father shows His love for us through His constant protection, love, forgiveness and guidance, so too did St. Joseph show vigilance in his love and care as a father and spouse.

Family Conversation: St. Joseph was chosen by God to be our Lord's earthly father. God is the Father of Jesus, but Joseph is the foster father called by God to care for Jesus in his earthly needs. Joseph

faithfully fulfilled his role to love, protect and provide for the Holy Family. This responsibility required that Joseph think first of his family and their needs. Mary and Jesus could turn to him in times of trouble, knowing that Joseph would listen and care for them. St. Joseph loved Mary and Jesus; they must have loved St. Joseph very much in return. Now, in heaven, St. Joseph cares for us the same way. As the patron saint of the Church, we should love him as Jesus and Mary did, learn from his life of faith, and turn to him in times of need.

Family Activity: Create a Family Shrine to St. Joseph. Look around your house for items to add to the shrine. Items to consider are a statue of St. Joseph, a holy card, or a picture. Place a small basket, bowl or box on the table with blank slips of paper. Use these papers throughout the week to add prayers and intentions you would like to offer to St. Joseph. Gather as a family once a week to read and pray for these intentions. Wednesday is traditionally set aside to honor St. Joseph. End each intention with the phrase, St. Joseph, pray for us. Consider adding new items to your St. Joseph shrine as you continue through this year dedicated to St. Joseph.



Prayer in Anticipation of Our 100th Anniversary



So...What is Most Holy Trinity Sunday and Why Celebrate It? Prayer of Consecration to the Most Blessed Trinity

Trinity Sunday is the first Sunday after Pentecost to honor the Holy Trinity—the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. On Trinity Sunday we remember with solemnity and praise the foundation in which we live and worship throughout the year. We are invited to encounter God as Three in One. The use of the Triune formula connects the church today with the historic church, born in the struggle of Christians throughout generations to express their beliefs about God in God's Very Being. On Trinity Sunday, the Christian Church ponders with joy and thanksgiving what the Father, Son and Holy Spirit have done to accomplish the salvation of sinful humanity. It is brought to remembrance how Christians should respond to the love God has shown us, praising Him and giving Him glory. We remember the Father as our Creator, the Son as our Savior and the Holy Spirit as our Comforter. O God of Mystery, within your very self you model the beloved community. You are the Wisdom within our hearts, The Word who dwells among us, The Spirit who calls us beyond ourselves. Let us know your presence here today in a new way, that we might celebrate your love and go forth rejoicing.

O Everlasting and Triune God, I consecrate myself wholly to you today. Let all my days offer you ceaseless praise, my hands move to the rhythm of your impulses, my feet be swift in your service, my voice sing constantly of you, my lips proclaim your message, my eyes perceive you everywhere, and my ears be attuned to your inspirations. May my intellect be filled with your wisdom, my will be moved by your beauty, my heart be enraptured with your love, and my soul be flooded with your grace. Grant that every action of mine be done for your greater glory and the advancement of my salvation. Glory be to the Father, Who by His almighty power and love created me, making me in the image and likeness of God. Glory be to the Son, Who by His Precious Blood delivered me from hell, and opened for me the gates of heaven. Glory be to the Holy Spirit, Who has sanctified me in the Sacrament of Baptism, and continues to sanctify me by the graces I receive daily from His bounty. Glory be to the Three Persons of the Holy Trinity, now and forever. Amen

On this day, let us remember all our young men and women from the parish who died serving our country, as well as those who are currently serving in the Military, that God will protect them.


Our morning Mass will be the regular 8:00am followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Mass at 7:00pm.
