Year of St. Joseph ~ December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021



Year of St. Joseph Indulgences

Granted by the Holy See from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021. The plenary indulgence is granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father) to the faithful who, with a spirit detached from any sin, participate in the Year of Saint Joseph on the occasions and in the manner indicated by this Apostolic Penitentiary:

- ✤ Meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Our Father
- Participate in a spiritual retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on Saint Joseph
- Perform a corporal or spiritual work of mercy
- Recite the Holy Rosary in families and between the husband and wife
- Entrust their work daily to the protection of Saint Joseph and to all believers who invoke with their prayers the intercession of the worker of Nazareth
- ✤ Pray the litany of Saint Joseph or some other prayer to Saint Joseph, typical of the other liturgical traditions, for the persecuted Church and for the relief of all persecuted Christians
- Pray any lawfully approved prayer or act of piety in honor of Saint Joseph especially on:
 - March 19th (Solemnity of St. Joseph)
 - May 1st (Feast of St. Joseph the Worker)
 - December 26th (Feast of the Holy Family)
 - The 19th day of every month
 - Every Wednesday (a day dedicated to the memory of the Saint according to the Latin tradition)
- ✤ The gift of plenary indulgence extends particularly to The elderly, The sick, The dying and All those who for legitimate reasons cannot leave their home who, with the spirit detached from any sin and with the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the three usual conditions, in your own home or wherever the impediment holds you, pray an act of piety in honor of Saint Joseph, consolation of the sick and patron of good death, confidently offering God the pains and difficulties of his life.

St. Helena Church Mass Reminders

Just a reminder that until further notice, according to the Archdiocese, the Sign of Peace is suspended, that is, there is **no handshake or waving.** When you come





to receive Holy Communion, place one hand on top of the other as the host will be placed on your hand. Please do not extend only 1 hand or grab or take the host. Biblically a tithe means 10%. All are asked to consider returning 10% of our income to the Lord (5% to the parish, 5% to God's other charities: e.g. St. Helena Outreach Center, Food Bank) in gratitude. The spiritual practice of tithing disposes us to make God first in every area of our lives! The aim is to secure not the tithe, but the tither, not the gift, but the giver—for God!

FROM THE PASTOR

Today we celebrate the 6th Sunday of the Easter. We have such a beautiful scripture for today: Jesus' commandment to his disciples as He said, "that you love one another as I have loved you."
